

CABIN CLOSING

CHORES LIST

Outdoor

- Wash and store garden furniture
- Pull out of the water all the leisure equipment (boat, canoe, kayak, pedal boat)
- Store garden tools and equipment
- Walk around the cottage to ensure that the exterior portion is in good condition
- Close all the windows, air vents and chimney
- Caulk doors and windows (if needed)

In the kitchen

- Empty and wash the pantry
- Empty and wash the fridge and freezer
- Unplug the refrigerator, defrost the freezer and leave the doors ajar
- Bring back bottles of beer and wine
- Store all linens and towels in an airtight box

In the bedroom

Remove sheets and wash bedding

Store bedding in an airtight box

Option 1: if you turn off the heating

Set the thermostats in Off mode

Turn off the water heater (manually or remotely, using the load controller)

Close the main water inlet (manually or remotely, with the Sedna valve)

Open all the taps and drain the pipes

Blow air into the pipes

Pour plumbing antifreeze down the pipes

Option 2: if you maintain a little heating

Assign the set temperature of 5°C to all your thermostats

Turn off the water heater (manually or remotely, using the load controller)

Others

- Cut the well's pump power supply (manually or remotely, using the load controller)
- Close the main water inlet (manually or remotely, using the Sedna valve)

Get a head start

To ensure that your cabin is comfortable from the first minutes you set foot in it, be sure to **turn on the heating, turn the water heater back on and open your main water inlet remotely.**

Execute these actions using the Neviweb app, which gives you full control of your smart devices.

Otherwise, automate everything with the geofencing feature, which allows you to activate instructions based on your distance from the cabin.
